(A) Comeral Remarks.

i. The enclosures are submitted from a compilation of the best information evaluable in the Malandhamma. Therever they do not agree an attempt has been used to recordic them through conference held between officers and men of the ship who were in a position to sec.

- It is the concenses of opinion on this ship that the JKAN BART only fired five or six salves during the engagement. In all probability she was receiving electrical power from ashere, and fairly early in the engagement the power was cut by shall fire from this vessel. We know she was hit at least once as the evictor observed it. Before we communed firing on her she put up a scake screen probably generated from the dock and kept it over her throughout the day so that all fire was indirect and spotting from air-craft was difficult.
- J. Recard the end of the first run I was informed that SI Heak had not replied for a period of four or five miretes and the consensus ap sered to be that II Henk was out of oppnission. This later proved totally in error. We hank also was severed by a large dust cloud or used a macks sursen. We believe that shells from this force probably temporarily disabled Al Heak causing the grow of the battery to seek shelter. After we had coased firing they



repaired whotever damage took place and through the resalcier of the day sontimed to fire spacectically whenever we were in range.

- 4. This vecsel respect firing with 16" shells at JEM BART and M Bank when the total placer reaching was approximately 40%, Later we engaged enough druleers and destroyers and used up mather 5%.
- 5. The final 7 rounds fixed at al Hank from a range of about 33,000 yards were fixed in order to unlead the guas through the mus le. This salve apparently caused a large explosion and it is possible that it destroyed one of the summittion draps.
- 5. In the future if it is intended for men of war to benderd land fortifications the ships so doing must be equipped with benderdrend summittee as armor pierwing shells up arently do not ascemulish extensive damage unless they made a direct hit.
- I personally do not believe we will ever know (unless the French tell us) just which ships mank vessels of the French Many. They were under fire from the AMADUMA, SANGHAM, at the mass time as MADUMENTED, TIGHTA and MESCALUSE were engaging them. In only one occasion did I cheerve a salve from this vessel land directly on a ship. Then the sacks and splash had cleared many that ship was as longer present. It the time I remember being quite annayed at the sunsery officer because he could not find the target to continue firing.

- JEAN BART and shore batteries on El 0703 Hank Point were observed to have opened fire on us.

Three salvos from enemy guns (JEAN BART and El Hank) landed close to this ship, Flagship of Commander Task Group 34.1.

Target - JEAN BART. Director fire. indirect following stable vertical and range keeper using a basic bearing that had been obtained on El Hank lighthouse. Fire nine salves of from six to nine shots, each. Plane spet was used when fall of shot was observed, Enemy macke screens and haze obscured the target. REMARKS

Stoke the was immediately taken under fire. It is believed that at least one ship was sunk and two were badly damaged during this phase. Their shots fell from 1000 yards short to 50 yards over.

Shell exploded when it hit second deck and damaged compartment A-208-L. Planking on main deck caught fire and was quickly extinguished by a damage control party.

Ship was maneuvered to avoid the torpedoes by passing between No. 3 and 4 in the spread counting from the left. No. 4 passed about 15 feet from the starboard side. Torpedoes were running very shall and were apparently near the end of -



ENDIOF PHASE III-B AND BATTLE

REMARKS

SEUKLI

Upon completion of the Battle we had expended 786 rounds of 16"/45 cal. in 134 salves for an average of 5.86 guns per salvo. This includes 17 salves limited to three guns because of divided fire wheigh can only be considered as an excellent performance in every respect. At the end of the engagement every gun on the ship was in service and ready to fire. At the end of the Battle Turret 1 had 84 rounds, Turret 2, 110 rounds available and 94 rounds in reserve, Turret 3, 99 rounds. The reserve ammunition was distributed to the three turrets in amounts to equalize their supply. The distribution required slightly in excess of 14 hours which is entirely too long for a condition of continuous engagement. The problem of ammunition distribution during battle should be given serious consideration for future ship design.
